The Value of Video in Marketing By: Justin Chan, Valley Creek Productions

There's an old expression that a picture is worth a thousand words. If that's the case- video has to be worth at least a million! Marketing and advertising using video is as old as the medium itself; dating back to the early days of television and cinema. Advertisers realized even back then, that having your eyes and ears could help make a lasting impression.

Fast forward to 2019 and with the advent of the internet, social media, and smart phones, video is available anywhere at anytime. Creating professional video content once cost tens of thousands of dollars and now individuals have the ability to shoot high quality video on our smart phones.

How can all this help your business? When potential clients are researching your company they are very likely to click on video links on your website and social media channels to learn more about your offerings and more importantly more about who you are as a company. Video allows you to present your company in the way the customer would experience it as if they walked through your doors. It gives them the ability to meet you and learn about your products and services before they even click the contact button or pick up the phone.

We hear from our small business clients all the time that when clients contact them they immediately recognize the name and voice from the videos they watched and during that initial meeting they feel like they already know the person they are talking with even though they have never met.

Think about how we interact with celebrities on TV and in the movies, when we watch interviews and follow them on social media we feel like we actually know them because of how open and honest they appear on camera and the amount of details they share on social media. That's what video should be doing for your business.



How can you start introducing more video to your marketing?

Creating video for social media is a good first step, Consumers are not expecting broadcast quality video when they visit Facebook and Instagram feeds. You want a consistent look and feel for your video messages, and they should be short (under a minute). For most video content you'll want to hold your phone horizontally, not vertical. This is the shape of most screens. Make sure lighting is decent; video needs a lot of light. That light should be coming towards the subject and not from behind the subject (avoid shooting towards a window or light source) Smartphone microphones are not great so it's a good idea to not have a lot of talking if any.

Watch your headroom when you shoot people, there should only be a small amount of empty space between the top of your subjects head and the top of the frame. Avoid fast pans and movements and try to hold the camera as steady as possible. Use iMovie or another basic free video editing app on your phone to cut the clip down. You can even add music and your logo to the video fairly easily using basic video editing apps on your phone.

Not sure what type of content your business needs?

Do a Google search of competitors from other areas of the country and see what they are doing for video on their social media channels. Topics should be engaging and add value to the consumer. If you are starting a video campaign plan to release videos at least every few weeks in between other posts. The more regular content you post the more followers and engagement you will have.

For your website it's best to bring in professionals to capture video. This content will live on your site for a few years and you want it to look good. Consumers expect smart phone video on your social channels but they expect professional video on a website. The most important pieces of a broadcast quality video for your website are:

Professional interviews using boom or lavaliere microphones

Video lighting and professional cinema cameras

Well lit and professionally shot video footage of your office, building, product and staff.

Drone footage to capture a bird-eye video of your facility

Custom logo animations and graphics

Before you start interviewing prospective video companies you should have a good idea of what your video needs are. Here are some questions you should think about.

-How many videos are needed?
-About Us?
-Product Specific?
-Hiring?
- Tips/Tricks?
-Who is going to speak for the company?
-How many locations do you have, will you need

What days/times is your office/store/facility available for shooting video?
When will you need the video complete?

Expect that most corporate video shoots will take between one and two days on location. During that time there will be some disruption of normal operations to set up lights and cameras for interviews and b-roll footage. Staff and owners will be pulled from normal responsibilities for interviews and to help coordinate the shooting. Allow 4-6 weeks to produce the edited video, if you need it sooner make sure the company has the time/staff for a more rushed job and expect to pay more for this. Most companies will need a week or two lead time before shooting to schedule staff and equipment for your shoot.




Good Samaritan Services Celebrates Milestone



Did you know that Chester County turned 337 years old on August 4, 2019? William Penn initially set the boundaries for Chester county back on August 4, 1682. As part of the Piedmont Region, in Southeastern PA, Chester County consists of 485,760 acres, of which just over 150,512 are currently in farm land according to the Ag Census of 2017.

There are approximately 949 registered farms in picturesque Chester County. Our federal government defines a farm as: "Any place from which \$1,000 or more of agricultural products were produced and sold, or normally would have been sold, during the year." With so many wonderful places to farm, grow food, work, vacation and raise families in Chester County, no wonder we are ranked among the leading stats in our nation as agricultural producers. Many of these products are raised by family farms and sold right here to folks in Chester County. To other counties, Chester is The general concept of a farm and Chester County is almost a ubiquitous term when it comes to PA agriculture.


